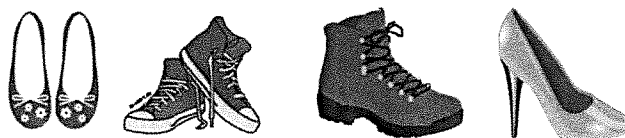

- Limited to 15 students per class
- Emphasis on color and design
- Introduction to art history, studying techniques and materials used
- Drawing and sketching
- Painting: studying techniques in watercolor, tempera, and acrylic paint
- Exposure to various media, including two dimensional and three dimensional design

Business 150 – Ms. Mary Dittman - FMU Dual Enrollment Course – Spring Semester

- Fundamentals of business
- Tuesday/Thursday only
- \$250 fee, plus book

Chorus – Mrs. Elizabeth Hunter

- Study and perform a variety of music
- Will include vocal technique, sight singing, and theory
- Performances include but are not limited to Christmas and Spring concerts and the Fine Arts musical production
- We will have a tremendous amount of fun on the way to artistic excellence!

Current Events – Mrs. Sandy Hill

- special speakers from various fields
- current events discussions on news from the newspaper/TV news/ internet headline/Social Media

Drama – Mrs. Susan Lee

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History 203 – Mr. Peter Worn – European History to the French Revolution – FMU Dual Enrollment – Fall Semester

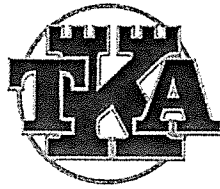

- \$350 fee, includes book - 4th period
- Must register by August 15 (Registration Day)

- Participate in sports, such as team fitness, soccer, volleyball, or basketball.
- Practice speed and agility drills to help develop athleticism
- Required to dress out and participate on a daily basis

Praise Band – Mr. Kelly Hayes

- Permission of instructor (student must complete application)

Teacher Cadet – Mrs. Ashley Nolette

- FLEXIBLE SCHEDULING – this class can be scheduled whenever a student has a free period, not just during elective periods
- Students will assigned to help with an on-campus class (usually a lower school class)
- Will require once-a-month lunch meetings which will be scheduled to suit students' schedules

Teacher Cadet DE – Mrs. Paige Alexander – FMU Dual Enrollment – year

- \$250 fee, plus book - 5th period
- Students will assigned to help with an on-campus class (usually a lower school class)
- Will require daily classroom attendance
- Will learn how to create & execute lesson plans

Tutorial Study Hall – Mrs. Tammy Moreau/Mrs. Janet Porter

- This class provides intensive assistance with daily homework and organization.
- This class will incur an extra charge. Please sign up through the Discovery Department. Regular Study Hall does not exist.

Web Design/Coding – Mrs. Paige Alexander

- Become a web designer using HTML and CSS
- Introduction to the history of the Internet and HTML language
- Manipulate source code to discover the functions of common tags and CSS attributes

Weight Training/Health for Boys Early Morning (PE Credit) – Mr. Mark Skiles

- Limited to 14 students
- Circuit training: running, speed work, agility drills, free weights & machines – alternating upper & lower body workouts

Student Driver Rules:

- Student Drivers must have a Driver Registration Form on file in the office before driving to school.
- Students must park in designated student parking lot.
- Students will not be allowed to linger in the student parking lot in the morning prior to the beginning of school or in the afternoon after school is dismissed.
- Students are expected to drive safely. Any student reported or seen driving recklessly will receive a warning and any further incidents will result in loss of driving privilege on school grounds
- The King's Academy is not responsible for students riding in vehicles where the driver is a TKA student to and from school.
- Generally, TKA does not allow students to drive on school sponsored trips. Exceptions to this policy may be granted by the Head of School when accompanied by the parent/guardian of the student driver as well as the parent/guardian of any student-passengers.
- TKA students will not be allowed to drive on off-campus outings (i.e. field trips, team ministry, sports events in which TKA provides transportation, etc.) that are school sponsored.
- TKA assumes no responsibility for students riding in a vehicle operated by another TKA student. In such cases where written parental permission does allow students to ride together, the parents assume all responsibility for the travel arrangement.
- The TKA Administration reserves the right to deny permission to TKA students to have a car on campus.
